## Minutes of the Neighbourhood Plan Chairs Group

Meeting 26<sup>th</sup> July 2016 at 11.30 am

In attendance: D McGifford, A Thompson, J Unsworth, P Aston, P Minshull, S Foster

- 1. Apologies were received from Cllr S A Smith (SAS), D Watson (DW), J MacArthur (DM), D Jones (DJ)
- 2. Minutes: of the Minutes from the meeting 24<sup>th</sup> May 2016 were approved without amendment
- 3. National Local Policy update: AT advised that :-
  - Government had increased its housing target from 240,000 up to 300,000 per annum
  - Reiterated its protection of the Greenbelt
  - Lack of mortgage finance is causing issues on housing development uptake
  - He will be attending a Local Plan Examination procedural meeting on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of August 2016
  - The Local Plan examination will be taking place from the 12<sup>th</sup> September for 2 weeks (at Congleton Town Hall) DM to liaise with AT re representations

### 4. Draft Neighbourhood Plan Progress AT

- AT outlined the differences in layout from different groups and stated we needed to adopt a consistent approach
- Requested that the Chairman review/ take the draft report to group members and feed comments back within 2 weeks
- AT to provide cross cutting themes which need to be reviewed by each section
- AT to generate a summary of the requirements for maps and appendices, JU to discuss with D J

#### 5. Funding

DM advised that there was still circa £30,000 in CTC earmarked reserves

#### 6. Other issues

- SF raised concerns re evidence provided via the WYG Retail Study which contradicts the thoughts of the N Plan Town Centre Group.
  - It appears that it does not take into consideration the predicted housing growth in Congleton and also questioning the methodology.
  - DM advised that CTC had formally written to CEC re these concerns and was awaiting a response which he would follow up with CEC officer A Clarke.
  - SF suggested that there should be a formal meeting request as well (subject to their written response)
- JU raised concerns about the location of an assisted housing scheme in the town centre –
   Worrall Street was put forward as a potential development area
- PA / PM raised concerns with regards to the commercial and housing developments to the north
  of Congleton and how they interlink between themselves and the town centre DM agreed to
  organise a meeting with Planning / Ansa PA PM and SAS this will be after the Local Plan
  Examination
